FROM THE RABBI

Election, our country, and us



Many of us will remember for a long time what we were doing on Tuesday night, Nov. 5 or first thing the morning of Nov. 6th. I know that on Tuesday night, I was glued to the TV as I followed the incoming results on my lap top. I had a few glasses of champagne and lots and lots of popcorn. I planned this “girl dinner” regardless of the outcome. It would either be celebratory or to console me, regardless, I knew that I would enjoy it.

I can see from the results and even from talking to members of our congregation that there are very different reactions to the election. There are many who are devastated, scared, and uncertain of what is to come. And there are those who are hopeful, relieved, and are looking forward to some of the promised changes. From where we stand, it can be hard to understand how another can see things so differently. This is why, I believe, as I spoke about on Erev Rosh Hashanah, that it is important that we keep relationships with family and friends, even if they voted differently in the election.

We have a crisis of misunderstanding in our country where people are polarized to such a degree that they think no one can authentically feel or believe otherwise. We need now more than ever to take the time to actively listen to one another. Posting and venting on social media doesn't persuade anyone to reconsider their views. This merely strikes lines of demarcation that say, “You are either with me or against me.” Instead, we need to pull our friends and family members closer to us and even if we agree not to discuss politics, we can still gain from the love and support we have earned over the years.

If we are brave enough, if we are anchored, we can ask, “Why did you vote in the way that you did? What are the benefits, in your opinion, to be gained for our country?” And then, do not argue with them! You can respond, as I instructed in my Rosh Hashanah sermon, with any of the following, “I notice that.... I appreciate that....I wonder that...” We can actively listen and learn from one another. Generally, once a person feels listened to and understood, they will be open to hearing why you believe as you do. We have a lot to learn from one another and we need our relationships to transcend political differences.

As we are embarking on a new chapter in America, perhaps we would be wise to not see all in stark terms. For those who see Trump as the devil incarnate, perhaps not everything he does will be evil, malicious, or harmful. Could there be some good that comes from his policies and even his personality? And for those who see his administration as a welcome reprieve, perhaps not everything he will do should be supported. Maybe, there are things that he will strive to do that must be condemned. We need an open mind to see how policies and events will unfold.

And for those who are scared, know that we will support you as your congregation. Our synagogue is and will remain a place of tolerance for those who are LGBTQ+ and those who are of different races, ethnicities and religious backgrounds. Our values are based on Torah, i.e., learning and studying the richness of our tradition. We observe the mitzvot that bring meaning to Shabbat, holidays, and life cycle observances. And we engage in acts of lovingness because

we are commanded to do so but also because it is who we are. Our values and tradition define us and can give us strength and community in a time when we need it most.

In times of upheaval, it is even more important to live by our traditions. Even if leaders of our country engage or say unsavory things, we can double down on being kind to one another. We have control over ourselves, what we say, what we do, and how we comport ourselves. To be a Jew in the best way is to be a light on to the nations. We can be a beacon of light for others by being welcoming, compassionate, caring, and understanding.

What I am saying, regardless of who you voted for in this last election, is that we need one another. You all make our congregation the vibrant place where we embrace the values of being a Reform Jew. We can strive on an individual level to rise up to be the best version of ourselves not just at a synagogue but also with our family, in our neighborhood, and in our community.

BOARD UPDATE



As we approach the end of the calendar year, let's look back on what the Brotherhood has accomplished so far in 2024/2025. On August 3, we held our annual baseball night, when the Angels took on the New York Mets, and on August 25, we hosted our annual membership barbecue, providing

beverages and delicious entrées of tri-tip and chicken, expertly barbecued by VP of Membership Jerrold Korn, for approximately 45 attendees to enjoy, to go with the salads, side dishes, and deserts brought by the congregants. On September 8, the Brotherhood kicked off the new school year by barbecuing hamburgers, hot dogs, and veggie burgers and dogs for approximately 50 students, teachers, and parents on the first day of Jewish school. And a big thank you to Jason Mino, who reinforced the roof of the Sukkah and singlehandedly took it down because a wedding necessitated its removal ahead of schedule.

On October 27, the Brotherhood inaugurated our remodeled sanctuary with a concert by Billy Nation, a Billy Joel tribute band. The concert was attended by approximately 125 people, and it was preceded by a lunch of pasta with marinara sauce, gnocchi with pesto sauce, garlic bread, and Caesar salad, all for \$10. The audience left the concert with smiles on their faces.

Also, please mark your calendars for upcoming Brotherhood events: a Brotherhood/Adult Ed Brunch on January 5, when VP of Programming Charlie Niederman will recount his personal experiences in "A Cold War Incident." On January 25, the Brotherhood, along with the Women of Beth David, will hold our annual membership dinner, and the Brotherhood's Annual Shabbat service will take place on February 14, which will be followed by another brunch on February 16.

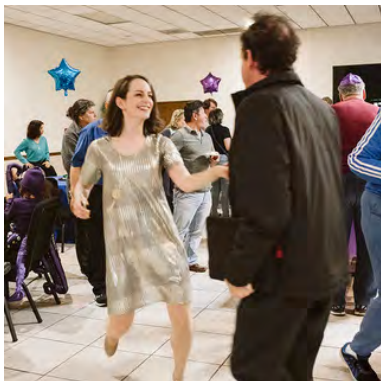
