

FROM THE RABBI

Promote Reform and Democratic values in Israel

Vote in the World Zionist Congress



Living here in the US can be frustrating because we don't vote in the Israeli elections, we don't have any power over the Knesset, and there are few avenues to change or effect Israeli policy. However, every five years, the World Zionist Congress (WZC) holds an election. The WZC elects the leadership of the World Zionist Organizations and brings together representatives from Jewish communities around the world to decide on issues affecting Jews and to allocate

1 billion dollars annually. Yes, that is 'b' for a billion.

If you are concerned about the rolling back of rights for LGBTA+ rights, gender equity, and religious pluralism, you need to vote. If it bothers you that Reform clergy and communities in Israel do not have equal protection and resources as their Orthodox ones, you need to take action. If it offends you that ultra-Orthodox Israelis don't serve in the Israeli Defense Forces, you need to have your voice heard. If right wing ministers, Itamar Ben-Gvir and Betzalel Smotrich's, attempts to disempower the Supreme Court and enact racist policies upset you, you really need to vote.

The Reform movement aims to protect fundamental rights for all Israelis and Reform Jewish communities. We advocate for democracy, freedom, security, and pluralism. It is ARZA (association of Reform Zionists) that represents us at the World Zionist Congress. Even though our movement is the largest denomination in North America, we struggle in Israel to get permission to build synagogues, employ rabbis, and even have our conversions and marriages recognized.

If we are able to get a greater representation through the WZC, we will strive to invest in communities destroyed on Oct. 7th, encourage a path to peace, and influence policies that affect Reform Jews in Israel, as well as millions of Israelis. In essence, our movement will advocate for democracy, pluralism, commitment to a Two-State solution, security, and equality.

If you are 18 or older, identify as Jewish, & live in the U.S., you can vote starting on March 10, 2025-May 4, 2025. https://www.vote4reform.org/

I would like to invite you to learn more on Tuesday night, March 11 @ 7:00 -8:00 p.m. on Zoom with Rabbi Josh Weinberg, Vice President of the URJ for Israel & Reform Zionism and Executive Director of ARZA. Please see your Shavua tov for Zoom address.

You will be hearing from the pulpit, in meetings, and through programming how important this is. Once you vote, please let me know @ Rabbimyers@templebethdavid.org. I will add you to our list and thank you in the next Megillah. Please also encourage your adult children to participate. Our goal is to have 50% of our congregation vote ARZA in the World Zionist Congress.



Picture Books ages 1-8 An Etrog From Across the Sea Sharing Shalom

Middle Grades ages 9-11 The Girl Who Sang: A Holocaust Memoir Finn and Ezra's Bar Mitzvah Time Loop

Young Adult ages 12-17 Night Owls The Forbidden Book

Sydney Taylor Award Winners

"An Etrog from Across the Sea" by Deborah Bodin Cohen and Kerry Olitzky, illustrated by Stacey Dressen McQueen and published by Kar-Ben Publishing, an imprint of Lerner Publishing Group, is the winner in the Picture Book category.

Papa has promised to bring an etrog (citron) for Sukkot from a trading voyage, but when his ship does not appear, Leah and Aaron return to the family's Hudson Valley homestead, hoping that he will arrive in time to celebrate with them. Hand-painted illustrations are styled after early American folk art.

"The Girl Who Sang: A Holocaust Memoir of Hope and Survival" by Estelle Nadel and Sammy Savos with Bethany Strout, illustrated by Sammy Savos, and published by Roaring Brook Press, a division of Holtzbrinck Publishing, is the winner in the Middle Grade category.

In this poignant, thoughtfully illustrated biographical graphic novel, Enia's happy Jewish childhood in rural Poland is cruelly disrupted when she is forced to hide from the Nazis. Enia, later called Estelle, suffers devastating losses and separations but draws on her inner resources and love of singing to endure.

"Night Owls" by A.R. Vishny, published by Harper, an imprint of HarperCollins Publishers, is the winner in the Young Adult category.

Molly and Clara are estries -- bread-eating, owl-shifting women vampires -- living in an indie cinema/former Yiddish theater. When Molly's girlfriend vanishes, the sisters team up with reluctant medium Boaz, facing down a monstrous Manhattan underworld to find her before they all disappear. An immersive urban fantasy with a Jewish twist.
